4. Matters arising

a. Affordable Housing Removal in relation to the new development at Holme Farm was discussed at some length. Concerns have been raised in relation to an Economic Assessment Document which has been submitted by JSA developments to Planning ERYCC. This document can be viewed on the Parish Council website and ERYCC Planning Portal Planning Application No.18/02505/STVAR. The conclusion being that both Ward Councillor Lisseter and the Parish Councillors present feel that further representations are required to ERYCC in relation to this matter. A request will be made to Planning ERYCC by the Clerk for an extension of time and this subject will be on the Agenda for the next Parish Council meeting with a view to submitting all comments/concerns raised at this meeting and forwarded to Planning ERYCC.

b. Damage was found in the Play Area to recently laid paving slabs at the entrance. The damage was caused by independent Contractors who had driven a large vehicle through the gates. After investigations made by the Clerk the Contractors accepted responsibility for the paving slabs who immediately rectified the matter within the week. Cllr Wilburn offered to make repairs to the gates, which has also been done and the Council are very grateful.

c. Cllr R Turner wanted to bring to Councils attention a leaflet that was distributed to households in Beeford in relation to Tree Planting in our area from the Woodland Trust. Clerk to make enquiries into this matter further.

d. VE Day celebrations are scheduled for the weekend commencing 8th May 2020. This celebration weekend will affect the whole village community and any Ideas/suggestions would be welcome for discussions in future PC meetings.

5. Correspondence

- a. There was a Driffield Travel Surgery in relation to a new bus on Service 136 (Driffield to Bridlington via North Frodingham and Beeford). The new bus was parked up in Driffield for the public to have a look around.
- b. A letter was received on behalf of the Holiday Club Team, from the Beeford Methodist Church for funding towards benefiting local children to attend during the School Holidays in August. It was proposed that a contribution of £250 be made towards this event going ahead.

- a. Operation Galileo is a national Police operation in relation to the enforcement and disruption of hare coursing. This has been successfully in operation over the last couple of years and a high number of arrests have been made in and around our area. Humberside Police will continue to tackle this issue which has shown a significant decrease over the last year.

11. Councillors updates

- a. Cllr Sawyer confirmed that the drains in Beeford along Main Street near Nightingales have been inspected with the possible cause being a suspected collapse of the drains.
