4. **Matters arising**

a. AD Fundraising update was given to Councillors with regard to events and money raised so far. Up to date events list continues to be displayed in Parish Council notice boards and website. Angela McKie and David Goodwin updated Councillors with regard to NOW group and the recruitment of a Barrister and advised a full meeting to be held on the 15<sup>th</sup> June at the Village Hall North Frodingham.

b. Chairman McCloud read out an email received from Clls Owen/Evison regarding the use of Parish Council funds being used to support a campaign such as the AD Plant. They confirmed that it is down to each individual Parish Council to ascertain if they wish to see funds directed in this fashion. The Parish Council will need to be fully satisfied as to the competence of the barrister to carry out the task and the likely costs involved. You do not have to be a rule 6 party to represent your views at an inquiry and third parties are probably better not applying for such status as it could be left open to the potential of a costs order being made against the third party.

David Goodwin will hand a copy of the elected Barrister's CV to the Clerk for consideration. Members of the public present at the meeting did concur they would have no problem with the Parish Council contributing towards funding. Chairman McCloud suggested to the Councillors a decision could not be made during this meeting and suggested a more indepth review to be carried out prior to the July meeting and asked for proposals to this suggestion.

It was therefore proposed to make a **final** decision with regards to funding at the next Parish Council meeting and this will be placed on the July Agenda.

### **Correspondence**

- a. Chairman McCloud read out an email received in response to the Parish Council's concerns about not being heard in relation to recent new planning developments that are being given approval for in Beeford. The response from Stephen Hunt - Head of Planning and Development Manager was that the Local Plan provides a housing figure of 90 dwellings for Beeford for the period 2012/2029 of which 4 allocations provide for an indicative housing capacity of 92 dwellings together with the expectation of a small number of "windfall" sites. He states that he does note from the Planning File our concerns raised, but the principle of development has been agreed through the Local Plan Process.
  
- b. Parish Council raised concerns with regard access to a new development and the bus stop south of 57 Main Street. Response was received from Joe Hughes - Highway Development - stating that the vehicle and pedestrian access to the development is located to the east of 57 and will be located at the position of an existing outbuilding which is to be demolished. The new access was assessed so as not to impact on the existing bus stop at the south, the position of the bus stop will not be altered.
