### The Learning & Skills Forum

#### The November meeting covered :

- Joint work with Scarborough Borough Council in January to develop links between employment and training opportunities along the Yorkshire Coast.
- Planning for the Annual Bridlington Jobs Fair at East Riding College on Tuesday 18th February aimed at local schools and college students, job seekers and the local workforce.
- Setting up a new local Employers Forum led by East Riding College, to meet for the first time in March 2020, to support local businesses and understand the recruitment and retention needs but also to gain support from businesses to offer work experience places and develop route ways to employment for the school and college leavers, unemployed individuals, and training for the current workforce.
- Updates from the local representative for the Construction Industry Training Board (CITB) including links with the Construction Hub offer in Hull and Scarborough, to improve skills in the construction sector.

Now we fast-forward to the 21st century and the partnership has re-adopted its original title and is now once again known as The Regeneration Partnership.

### Regular updates

Now that there is a great deal more work that has been completed and even more

regeneration work underway and planned for the coming years, the team of volunteers on The Regeneration Partnership Board decided it was time to update Regeneration News for the 21st century, resurrect the original format but now distribute it electronically, to save costs on reproduction and delivery. 

## Communication

## Lobster Capital of Europe

Many local residents and most of our visitors may be completely unaware that Bridlington is the Lobster Capital of Europe - with over £9M of catch landed in 2018. Around 90% of the catch is exported to Europe, The Far East and even The United Arab Emirates.

However there is still sufficient in Bridlington for us to really begin to capitalise on the tourism benefits that this kind of Food Tourism can bring to Bridlington and the surrounding areas.

At the recent **Open Bridlington Business Forum** meeting, D Harness & P. Andrews from University of Hull presented ideas to develop Bridlington's status as Lobster Capital of Europe. Further work to develop this concept is being carried out with support from the Holderness Coast Fisheries Local Action Group (FLAG), which has also funded a wide range of projects relating to the fishing sector along the Holderness Coast, including last year's Bridlington Seafood Festival.

Food Tourism is the largest growing sector in the tourism industry and using Yorkshire, as one of the most well-known tourism brands in the UK, there is opportunity to hit new heights in tourism for the area, creating a new high quality appeal.

Combining the Yorkshire brand with food tourism and coming up with a strong brand for Bridlington's lobster and crab expertise is what will offer the area huge opportunities to grow a whole new niche tourism sector. Work is also underway to secure long-term the annual Seafood Festival to support these plans – the next date has now been confirmed as Saturday 20th and Sunday 21st June 2020.

## Major Schemes currently underway

### Gypsy Race Park

Esh Construction started building the next phase of the Gypsy Race Park in November 2019 which will continue the new linear park from Hilderthorpe Coach Park to the new Beck Hill Bridge. Engineering work to the banks of the Gypsy Race will make more space for people to enjoy the green areas and wildlife can flourish. Natural play and seating areas will be created allowing the whole family to enjoy the outdoors, and engaging information boards will be installed so the people can discover more about Bridlington's nature and cultural heritage. New trees will be planted and existing areas of woodland will be managed with a new path built so people can explore the natural world on their doorstep.

**The Gypsy Race Park is part funded by European Regional Development Fund and East Riding of Yorkshire Council.**

Many people have enjoyed the first part of the Gypsy Race Park, completed earlier this year; but unfortunately some vandalism damage has taken place which we are working to resolve. ### Townscape Heritage Scheme

Andrew Uttley has recently joined the Bridlington Renaissance team to take up the role of *Townscape Heritage Officer* until the end of the scheme. Along with the management and coordination of events and programmes to encourage public engagement with

the rich history and heritage of Bridlington. A key feature of the project is the *Townscape Heritage Grant* scheme - which is aimed at the structural repair, reinstatement and reuse of buildings in the TH Area, which have a heritage interest and will continue to bring about significant benefits to the appearance of the **TH and Bridlington Quay Conservation Areas**. We are in regular contact with the owners and tenants of properties within the TH Area about the grant scheme and are receiving ongoing enquiries. **The scheme is entering its last year of availability and funding is still available for new applications.** If this is something you may be interested in or feel you are eligible for and could benefit from (grants are available to cover up to 80% of the costs incurred), please get in touch with Andrew at [bridlington.regeneration@eastriding.gov.uk](mailto:bridlington.regeneration@eastriding.gov.uk)

### Brid ITP2 (Integrated Transport Plan 2) - Stage 1 Station Plaza

Works at the Railway Station continue with the new access road and drainage system now under construction.

Once finished these works, which include the new disabled and short stay car park and link road, will complete the £13.3m investment as part of the Bridlington Integrated Transport Plan Phase 2 (jointly funded by the Humber LEP and ERYC).

**These works are currently on programme to complete in the summer of 2020.**

### Town Centre Sea Front Public Realm

The Town Centre Seafront Scheme began on site in September with the contractor North Midland Construction (NMCN), commencing work on Garrison Square. They are currently installing new paving in that area and on the east side of Esplanade. The £4.8m project which is funded by ERYC and York North Yorkshire and East Riding Local Growth Fund includes comprehensive remodelling of the public realm along Garrison Street and Esplanade from Garrison Square in the south to *East Riding Leisure Bridlington* in the north, and it includes remodelling of the junctions with the adjoining streets and Regent's Gardens. In many areas this includes full reconstruction of the road base, working around the existing utility services. **During the works all local businesses are open as usual and we are liaising closely with them to ensure that the inevitable disruption is kept to a minimum.**
